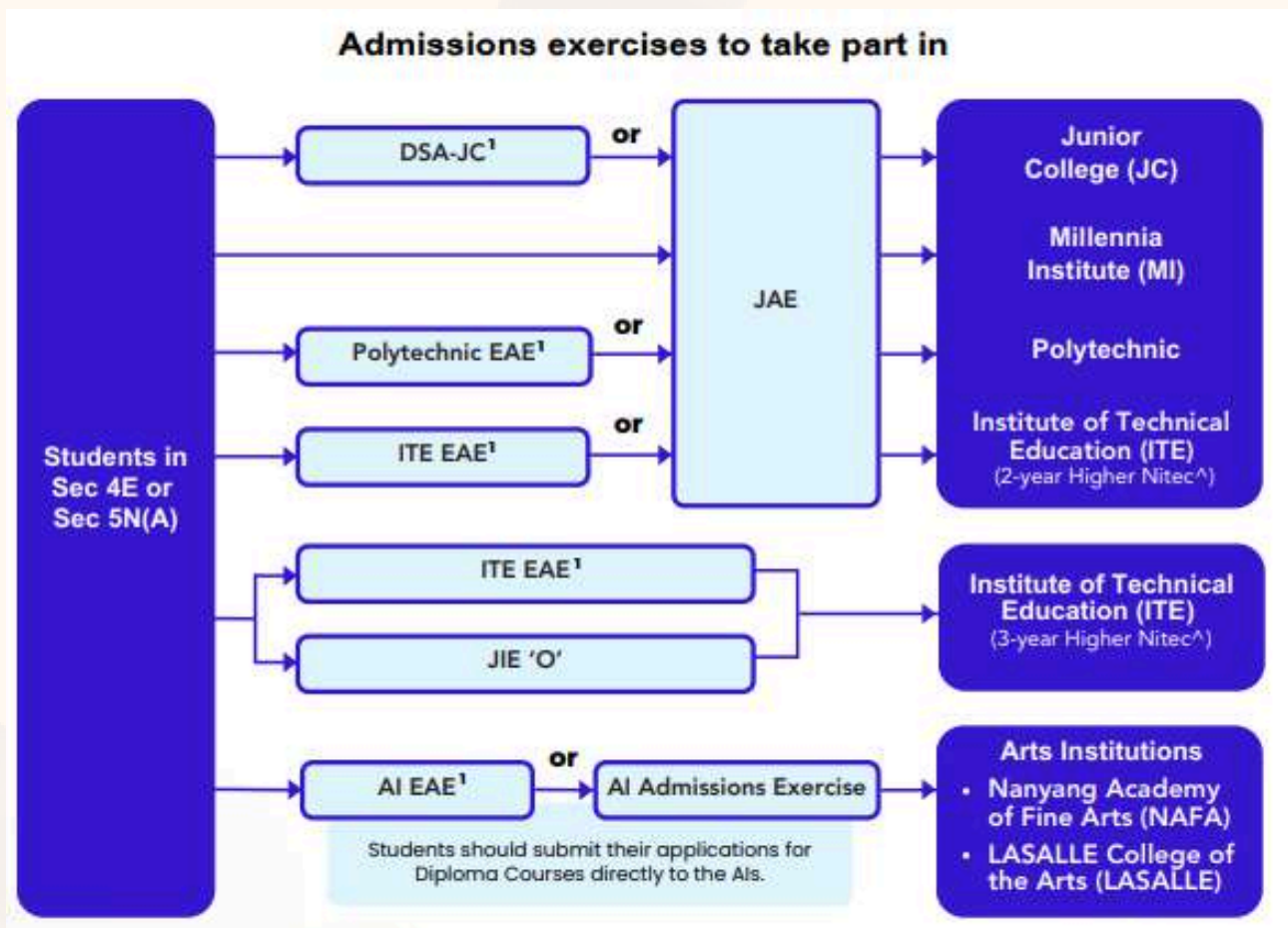

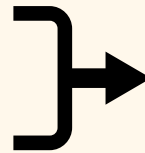

Eligibility Criteria

By merit with **gross** aggregate score and/or **minimum entry requirements (MER)**

Gross : before deducting CCA bonus point

Eligibility does not guarantee **placement**

Course Posting

Usually involves ranking the **net** aggregate scores of eligible students.

Net : after deducting CCA bonus point

Posting is subject to competition based on **merit** and **availability** of places.

How to best choose your 12 admission choices

OVERVIEW

The national examinations are one of many milestones in your education journey.

The next step of your journey is filled with many opportunities and pathways for you to explore!

Explore and Research on education pathways, educational institutions and courses, industries and job roles that can lead to my career aspirations



First one-third of choices available (top 4)

Consider the courses that most align with your Values, Interests, Personality & Skills (V.I.P.S) and strengths.



Second one-third of choices available (next 4)

Choose what you are interested in and stand a good chance of getting into by considering the last aggregate scores of the courses in each institution (where your net score is within the range of the last year's aggregate score) in CourseFinder/SchoolFinder.

Last one-third of choices (last 4)

Include alternative courses and institutions where the last aggregate scores are higher than yours. With this, your chances of securing a place will be higher.

Fill up all choices even if you are really confident of getting into your desired course.



How to best choose your 12 admission choices

EXAMPLE

- Meets all the Minimum Entry Requirements of all courses and JC
- L1R5 with 2 CCA Bonus Points: $16 - 2 = 14$ Points
- Prefers Arts Stream in JC
- ELR2B2 with 2 CCA Bonus Points: $14 - 2 = 12$ points

- Apply 3-year Polytechnic courses of interest via the Direct Admissions Exercise (DAE)

Direct Admissions Exercise (DAE)

- Each polytechnic runs its own Direct Admissions Exercise (DAE) for students with local or international qualifications who are not eligible to apply for courses under other admissions exercises.
- For most polytechnics, you will need to meet the course-specific **Minimum Entry Requirements (MER)** and may require a portfolio.
- Note that meeting the MER is not a guarantee that you will be shortlisted. Shortlisting is based on merit and course availability in the year of application. Do note that the options under DAE are limited and chances may not be high.

Programs focus on practical application, allowing students to create original work to respond to real-world challenges in the creative industries.

Specific disciplines and skills:

Visual Arts:

Learn about drawing, painting, sculpture, digital media, and more, with a focus on using materials, tools, and techniques to express ideas.

Design:

Study design principles and apply them to create solutions in areas like communication design, object design, and interaction design.

Media Arts:

Develop skills in areas like animation, game art, and cinematic arts.

Performing Arts:

Specialize in dance, theatre, or music through intensive training.

Creative Writing:

Develop your creative writing skills through workshops and courses.

Arts Management:

Retaking O-Levels or taking a gap year as a Private Candidate or enrolling in Private institutions

To consider retaking my GCE O-Level examinations as a school candidate or taking a gap year as a Private Candidate, I can think about these questions:

- What will I do differently to achieve a better outcome?
- What can I do / do I need to do to manage the demands of the syllabus?
- You are encouraged to look for your form teachers, Year Head and ECG Counsellor for further advice on this as:
 - 1.school staff will need to check with school on its practice and criteria to repeat GCE O-Level examinations as a school candidate in 2026.
 - 2.you will need to think on your concrete plans (i.e. part time work, tuition, EAE in 2026, registration of national examinations) as a private candidate in 2026

To consider enrolling in a private education institution, I can think about these questions:

- What do I have to consider if I want to enrol in a private education institution?
- Have I considered the 3Rs?
 - 1.Reasons – What will furthering my studies in this course allow me to achieve?
 - 2.Readiness – How ready am I to further my studies?
 - 3.Risks – Do I know the possible drawbacks?

Special educational needs (SEN) support at the IHLs

- Epilepsy

- Psychiatric Condition
- Uncontrolled Diabetes
- Uncontrolled Hypertension
- Uncontrolled Asthma
- Mobility Restricted (Hindering Performance)
- Physical Dependence upon Mobility Equipment

Opticianry



Eyecare practitioners are required to provide care, consultation and management of a patient's vision through eye tests and effective communication.

All applicants must possess the following abilities to perform direct eyecare on clients safely and effectively:

- Mental-Cognitive ability, including interpersonal-communication, emotional-behavioural stability to function under stressful work environment, and provide safe eyecare to clients.
- Physical ability to move around in a clinical/retail environment, including standing during service delivery.
- Auditory ability to communicate with patients under normal speaking level sounds.
- Visual ability to read small print on ophthalmic trial lenses and digital display on instruments.

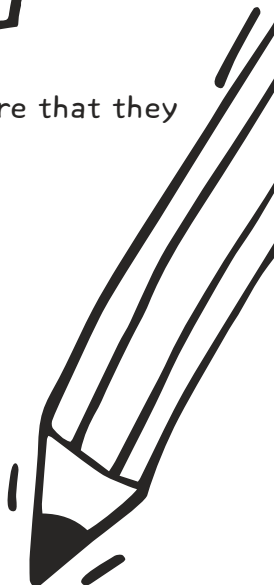

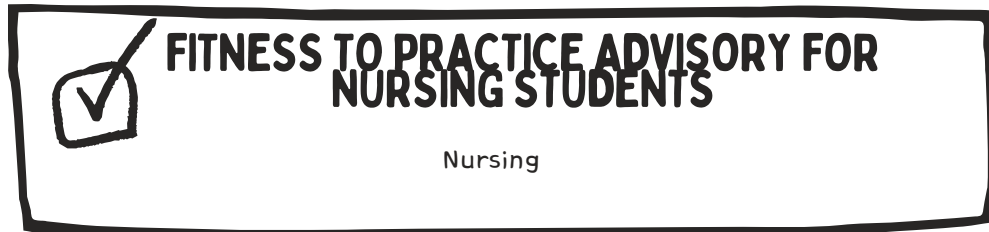

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All prospective healthcare students must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 with a vaccine regime recognised in Singapore. Those who are Medically-Ineligible will be subjected to prevailing MOH and healthcare institutions' policies.

Due to the job-specific requirements of the healthcare profession in the delivery of direct patient care, all applicants have to pass a pre-admission medical examination and fulfil 'Fitness to Practice Advisory' for nursing student stipulated by the Singapore Nursing Board:

FITNESS TO PRACTICE ADVISORY FOR NURSING STUDENTS

As the delivery of direct patient care is a requisite of healthcare professions, all applicants must pass a medical examination and be certified to have the following abilities to perform patient care activities in a safe and effective manner:

- 1) Mental-Cognitive ability (interpersonal-communication ability and behavioural stability)
- 2) Physical ability
- 3) Auditory ability
- 4) Visual ability

The above required abilities are stipulated in consultation with Singapore Nursing Board to ensure nursing students are fit to practise when they apply for enrolment upon graduation from the nursing programme. Interested applicants with known condition(s) or unsure if their condition(s) may affect their ability to deliver safe and effective patient care are highly encouraged to contact ITE College East at college_east@ite.edu.sg for more information.

JAE Appeal:

Applicants who wish to make an appeal may submit an appeal application via this portal for up to six polytechnic diploma and/or ITE 2-year Higher Nitec courses, where:

- You have met the course's minimum entry requirements, and
- Your aggregate score is equal to or better than that of the last student successfully posted into the course in the current year's JAE.

**Accelerate Pathways Programme for ITE 3-Year Higher Nitec:**

Students can complete their 3-Year Higher Nitec courses in 2 years and 3 months (i.e. 9 months earlier) under the Accelerated Pathways Programme:
High achievers who meet the minimum GPA requirement (e.g. 3.7 or higher out of 4) in their first semester can qualify.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Course Eligibility and Requirements

Q My net aggregate score is equal to or better than the previous year's Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE) cut-off point for a course. Does that guarantee my admission into that course?

A Your admission into that course is not guaranteed.

The previous year's JAE net aggregate scores are provided as a reference only and the cut-off points are based on the net aggregate scores of the last admitted student into the courses in that year.

The Ministry of Education (MOE) and schools do not predetermine the net aggregate scores in the current year's JAE. These scores can vary from year to year, due to factors such as the O-Level performances of students and their chosen courses during the JAE.

2. Submit Application

Q Can I not get a place in a course under the Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE) even if I choose it as one of my choices and meet the course's cut-off point (COP) in the current JAE?

A You might not get a place if others with same net aggregate score competing for the last available place in the course.

If there are 2 or more applicants with the net aggregate score competing for the last place in the course, their posting will be determined according to citizenship status, in this order:

1. Singapore Citizens (SC)
2. Permanent Residents (PR)
3. International students

If citizenship is the same (e.g., both SC), the one with a better gross aggregate score will be posted to the course.

If there is still a tie, a computerised ballot will decide the posting outcome.

3. Release of Posting Results

Q What happens if I am not posted to any of course choices that I submitted in the Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE)?

A If there are no more vacancies at any of your chosen course choices, you will be allocated a course of the same institution type as your first choice, subject to available vacancies and for which you met the course's entry requirements. For example, if you have indicated JC as your first choice, you will be allocated to a JC course with vacancy.

However, you may still not be allocated any course if the courses that you are eligible for do not have any more vacancies.

To have a better chance of getting posted, maximise your 12 choices during the JAE application and consider courses wisely that cater to your learning interests, styles, and aspirations. You should also consider the likelihood of being posted into the courses by choosing those where your net aggregate scores are better than the cut-off points, based on last year's admitted applicants' scores. This can increase your chances of being posted to your chosen courses.
